5	ICAL SUBDIVISION SHALL BE NULL AND VOID.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Idaho:

SECTION 1. That Chapter 33, Title 18, Idaho Code, be, and the same is hereby amended by the addition thereto of a <u>NEW SECTION</u>, to be known and designated as Section 18-3326, Idaho Code, and to read as follows:

- 18-3326. CONSISTENCY IN KNIFE REGULATION. (1) Except as in accordance with sections 18-3302 and 18-3302A, Idaho Code, a city, county or other political subdivision of this state shall not enact any ordinance, rule or tax relating to the transportation, possession, carrying, sale, transfer, purchase, gift, devise, licensing, registration or use of a knife or knife making components in this state.
- (2) A city, county or other political subdivision of this state shall not enact any rule or ordinance relating to the manufacture of a knife that is more restrictive than any rule or ordinance relating to the manufacture of any other commercial goods.
- (3) Except as in accordance with sections 18-3302 and 18-3302A, Idaho Code, any rule or ordinance of a city, county or political subdivision of this state that contradicts the provisions of this section shall be null, void and of no force and effect.
